Act on Acceptance and the HEFCE OA Policy

The Faculty needs to take cognizance of and act promptly to integrate into its research culture the online recording of the journal articles and conference publications of individual faculty members.

The key points are:

- 1. Only journal articles and conference publications with ISSNs deposited in ORA will be eligible for submission to the REF.
- 2. This deposit requirement does not apply to monographs.
- 3. Deposit is made via Symplectic, which acts as a 'letter box' for ORA.
- 4. This policy starts on 1 April 2016.
- 5. The version of the journal article and conference publication accepted by the journal or editor NOT the published version has to be deposited within THREE MONTHS of acceptance. Hence the formula *Act on Acceptance*.
- 6. The full published text will become available after the



embargo period imposed by journals. This is usually 24 months after date of publication. Bodleian staff will take care of this.

The system can be easily accessed at openaccess.ox.ac.uk.

The following are in place to facilitate the system:

- a) the Director of Research, Dr Robert Gildea, acts as a 'champion' for the system; explaining, publicizing etc.
- b) the Faculty's Librarian, Isabel Holowaty, is available with technical information e.g. what should be deposited, help with citations, troubleshooting, etc.


