Early marginal annotations, probably in the same hand as those in item 1, and perhaps also that of the manuscript additions on blank leaves following items 1 and 6 and on the last blank page of item 4. On [a₇^v] of item 6, 'Ex libello de Moribus. Hinc bene precipiebatur a Socrate vt adolescens in speculo . . .'; on the recto of the blank leaf following item 6, a note on the four Sundays in Advent: 'Quatuor dominicis proximis ante festum natale . . .'; on the verso, 'Formula bene viuendi.
