JSTOR is an interdisciplinary journals database with over 1000 academic journals. The database provides electronic back issues of older issues of academic journals, often from its earliest date and stopping within the last 5 years.

Accessing the database

To access the databases, go to the Sainsbury Library website at

<https://my.sbs.ox.ac.uk/user/login> (for MBS members only) and click on DATABASES.

If accessing this database outside the Oxford network, you will be prompted for your **Single Sign-On (SSO)**

Searching the database

Either enter your keywords into the basic search box or click on the Advanced Search option if you want to

be more specific about where your keywords are searching or if you want to search in particular journals.

Here you can narrow the search by selecting a subject area and other criteria.

You can set up email alerts for when a new volume of a journal has been published or articles matching a saved set of keywords are published. To do this click on the LOGIN link to the top right of the *JSTOR* homepage and then click on the REGISTER link.
