

The [Chemistry Department](#) at Oxford is one of the leading chemistry departments in the world with around 80 academic staff carrying out international-level research. Each year some 170 chemists graduate after a four-year MChem course which includes a year of research and about 80 graduates receive doctorates. The Department will be celebrating [International Year of Chemistry 2011](#) with a series of events in the Autumn, organised in conjunction with the [University Botanic Garden](#) (details to be announced).



The resulting workshop was "**From practice to publication: professional assistance from the librarian**" which covered our support for nurses who are preparing articles for publication and the role librarians can play in preparing systematic reviews. It also looked at the reasons clinicians want to write papers, and the barriers to publication which the librarian can help overcome.

Free Presentation and Workshop: "New Models of Support for Translational Research"

Dr Kristi Holmes, Bioinformaticist, Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, will give a presentation on **September 12th from 2pm to 3pm** in the [Lincoln](#) EPA Science Centre. This will be followed by a hands-on introduction to key bioinformatics resources at the [RSL](#) from **3.30pm**.

The presentation will focus on the role of libraries in meeting the changing information needs of clinical and research communities and the workshop will include :

- Introduction to Entrez, the integrated search and retrieval system for the major sequence, structure, taxonomy, genome, expression, and chemical databases
- Strategies for navigating and querying these databases with a demonstration of MyNCBI, a central place to customize NCBI Web services
- Step-by-step instructions on accomplishing some of the most common tasks at NCBI across a wide variety of topics
- Introduction to genome resources and a discussion of how they can be used in this new era of genomic medicine

All members of the University are welcome to attend but reservations are essential.
