# *Open Access Requirements*



Students receiving *RCUK Training Grant* Funding from 1st February 2014 are required to fulfill the **OPEN ACCESS** requirements of the funding council involved


- In the case of Ph.D. theses funded by Research Councils, metadata describing the thesis should be lodged in the institution's repository as soon as possible after award and a full text version should be available within a maximum of 12 months following award. It is expected that metadata in institutional repositories will be compatible with the metadata core set recommended by the *ETHOS e-thesis online service*.!

- ▶ *Students must have deposited both formats of the thesis prior to attending a graduation ceremony.*

- ▶ Examinations Schools check that both copies have been deposited when students are listed as intending to attend a degree ceremony.
- ▶ Note that the deadline for depositing both the hard copy & the digital copy is ***5pm on the Wednesday prior to the graduation ceremony*** you are intending to attend. After this time there is no guarantee that the deposit of the thesis will be checked in prior to the ceremony.

# *Type of considerations required*

“I plan to use images in my interviews, presenting them to interviewees and asking them for their response. I shall then use these to develop conversation.

One is a poster for the Daily Telegraph’s Hands Off Our Land campaign.

The other is technically a montage that I have put together of six images I found on the web.

Am I allowed to use these images without asking for permission from the people who posted them on the web? I would acknowledge the sources of each individual image, but is this enough?

Even if I could use them in interviews, would I be able to include the images in my thesis?

I don't want to infringe any copyright rules!”



# Type of considerations required

There's no problem in using the images while conducting the research.

There's no problem in actually including them in the dissertation (acknowledgement is all that's needed), as it's part of an examination process.

**The potential issues arise from further use. A doctoral dissertation destined for deposit in ORA constitutes further use, because by putting it in ORA you are communicating it to the public, and the protection you have from its being a dissertation falls away.**

ORA will ask you to confirm that you have obtained the necessary rights, or ask you to redact the offending material. (If you want to use the material in a published article, that's also further use). So let's just review what the copyrights and implications are.

- First picture – it's clear that this is the Telegraph's (or maybe not – could be the artist who designed it! But you'd go to the Telegraph in the first instance) You can presume it's 'all rights reserved'.

- Second picture – the montage doesn't negate the copyrights in the existing pictures, but you have your own copyright in the selection and arrangement. You would need to go back to the source(s) to see what the rights are, and if any are being waived eg through the use of a Creative Commons licence. If you can't find any evidence of waiver, then it's all rights reserved and you need permission.


- UNLESS: we can use the provision in the Copyright Act (section 30) that you are reproducing the images for the purposes of criticism or review – i.e. people/you are talking and writing about the images themselves, not just using them as a trigger for other discourse. So long as you have some criticism or review in there (for the montage, it would be for each of the elements individually) you would have a defence.

IF somebody comes from the woodwork and pursues you (highly unlikely), that would be your response, but you'd still have to argue that in court or, more likely, decide whether it's worth the trouble and expense of going to court to defend it (as indeed the plaintiff would have to make a similar judgement).

Note: if this is a dissertation for which deposit in ORA is not required but deposit in a library is, then that's OK, as deposit in a library does not in itself involve any infringing acts. !!

# Current Awareness Services

The information explosion during 1950's & 60's gave rise to fears of not being able to keep up to date with the literature and so current awareness services came into being.

Originally hardcopy and postal services.

Advent of the internet has vastly improved such services.



# ELECTRONIC ALERTING SERVICES (EAS)

EAS make use of e-mail and e-databases.

In the academic community these are usually subscribed to by the Institution and so are free to the end-users.

*WARNING : No database is comprehensive and no matter how well you frame your enquiry, an EAS will never be as clever as your brain is at picking out material of interest.*

# RSS = Really Simple Syndication

- ▶ RSS is a family of web feed formats
  - ▶ A web feed is a data format used for serving users frequently updated content.
  - ▶ Content distributors syndicate a web feed
  - ▶ thereby allowing users to subscribe to it.

# *Current Awareness*



## Three ways to keep up to date:

- Saving and rerunning searches – you save a search and run it again in the future.
- E-mail alerts / RSS feeds:–
  - Specify a search to be repeated and the results emailed to you at chosen intervals or on a continuous basis
  - Select your favourite journal(s) & the database will tell you when the next issue of a journal is available.
- Citation Alert – you will receive an email every time a particular article is cited in another WoS or Scopus indexed article.

# *Citation Tracking*



**iSkills: Research Impact - citation analysis tools (Wed 11 Nov 14.00 - 15.30)**

An introduction to citation tracking and bibliometrics, using a range of 'impact factor' tools to find top journals and conferences, count citations and measure the impact of publications and researchers. Looking at their strengths and weaknesses, and how to access them.

Covering: Journal Citation Reports, SCImago Journal Rank, Web of Science, Scopus, Google Scholar, Essential Science Indicators, ORCID, etc.



# Databases vs. Search engines

- Contents are indexed by subject specialists
- **Subject headings**
- Limiting functions e.g. publication types, language

Allow you to

- **View Search history**
- **Combine searches**
- **Mark and sort results**
- **Print/save/email/export**
- **Save searches**
- **Set up alerts**

- Searches done by automated “web crawlers”
- **No thesaurus / subject headings – just free text searching**
- **No limiting functions**
- **Usually none of these!**

# Databases (Scopus or Web of Science) enable you to:



- Refine results overview to find the main journals, disciplines and authors that publish in your area of interest.
- Click on the cited by and reference links to track research trends and make connections.





## Wildcards

Wildcards can be used in all search fields that allow words and phrases. They can be used in a search query to represent unknown characters.

- The asterisk (\*) represents any group of characters, including no character.
- The question mark (?) represents any single character.
- The dollar sign (\$) represents zero or one character.

### General Rules about Wildcards

- You can use left-hand truncation in the following search fields in all Web of Science product databases: Topic, Title, Accession Number, and Identifying Codes.
- In Topic and Title searches, you must enter at least three characters after the wildcard when using left-hand truncation. For example: \*bio
- In Accession Number and Identifying Code searches, you must enter at least one character after the wildcard when using left-hand truncation. For example: \*2307
- In Topic and Title searches, you must enter at least three characters before a wildcard when using right-hand truncation. For example: bio\*
- In Author searches, you must enter at least two characters before the wildcard when searching a last name: For example: sm\*
- Wildcards may be used inside a word. For example, odo\$r finds odor and odour.
- You cannot use wildcards after special characters (/ @ #) and punctuation (. , ; !).
- You cannot use wildcards in a publication year search. For example, 2007 is OK but 200\* is not.
- You cannot search on a wildcard if it appears in a word or name. For example, the search TS=E\*Trade OR TS="E\*Trade" will not return records about this company.
- You cannot use the dollar sign (\$) in quoted searches.
- Avoid using wildcards in search queries with very broad truncation matches. For example, a search on UT=\*2 or UT="2" or UT="\*22" or UT="\*22\*" may return incomplete results (or no results) because there are simply too many matches in the product database.

### Wildcards, Hyphens, and Apostrophes

The search engine treats hyphens (-) and apostrophes (') in names as spaces. For example:

AU=O Brien returns the same number of results as AU=O'Brien.

Try searching for names with and without a space. For example, AU=OBrien OR AU=O Brien returns both variants of the name.

When searching for hyphenated query terms, enter the term with and without wildcards. For example:

- TS=hydro-power returns records that contain the terms hydro-power and hydro power.
- TS=hydro\*power returns records that contain the terms hydropower and hydroelectricpower.
- TS=hydro power returns records that contain the terms hydro and power anywhere in the record, such as hydro-power, hydro-electrical power, and hydro

## Truncation and Wild Cards

Truncation and wild cards let you utilize root words to find variations of terms that might be valuable to your overall search. Use the following techniques to find variations of terms that you might not have considered.

In Ovid, database mapping must be turned off for truncation and wild cards to operate properly. If you do not turn off mapping, Ovid attempts to map truncated terms to subject headings, and must issue an error message.

<code>&lt;rootword&gt;\$</code> <i>or</i> <code>&lt;rootword&gt;*</code>	<p><i>Unlimited right-hand truncation</i> searches for variations on a word that are formed with different suffixes. For example, a search for <i>gene*</i> finds occurrences of <i>gene</i>, <i>genes</i>, <i>genetics</i>, and <i>generation</i>.</p>
<code>&lt;rootword&gt;\$&lt;n&gt;</code> <i>or</i> <code>&lt;rootword&gt;*&lt;n&gt;</code>	<p><i>Limited right-hand truncation</i> restricts the number of characters following the word. For example, a search for <i>dog\$1</i> finds occurrences of <i>dog</i> and <i>dogs</i> but not <i>dogma</i>.</p>
#	<p>The <i>mandated wild card</i> character stands for <b>one</b> character within a word or at the end of a word. For example, <i>organi#ation</i> finds occurrences of <i>organization</i> and <i>organisation</i>, and <i>dog#</i> finds occurrences of <i>dogs</i> but not <i>dog</i>. It can be useful for irregular plurals. For example, <i>wom#n</i> finds occurrences of <i>woman</i> and <i>women</i>.</p>
?	<p>The <i>optional wild card</i> character stands for <b>zero or one</b> characters within a word or at the end of a word. It is useful for retrieving records with British and American spelling variations because it finds words whether or not the extra character is present. For example, a search for <i>colo?r</i> finds occurrences of <i>color</i> and <i>colour</i>.</p>

## Boolean Operators

Boolean operators are reserved words which Ovid interprets as commands when you enter them in combination with a query or results set numbers onto the Main Search Page keyword command line. Use these operators to define a search:

- For records that contain terms of interest to you
- Between results sets in your search history

OR            NOT            FREQ            AND            ADJn

Ovid applies command operators to a query and searches through the default fields of the database(s). For example, with the following Boolean search query, Ovid looks for the terms cats and dogs in the default fields of the database(s) being searched.

cats <operator> dogs

### Wildcards and truncation

You can use wildcards and truncation when you're looking for documents that contain spelling variants, or words that begin with the same character string.

Character	Description	Example
