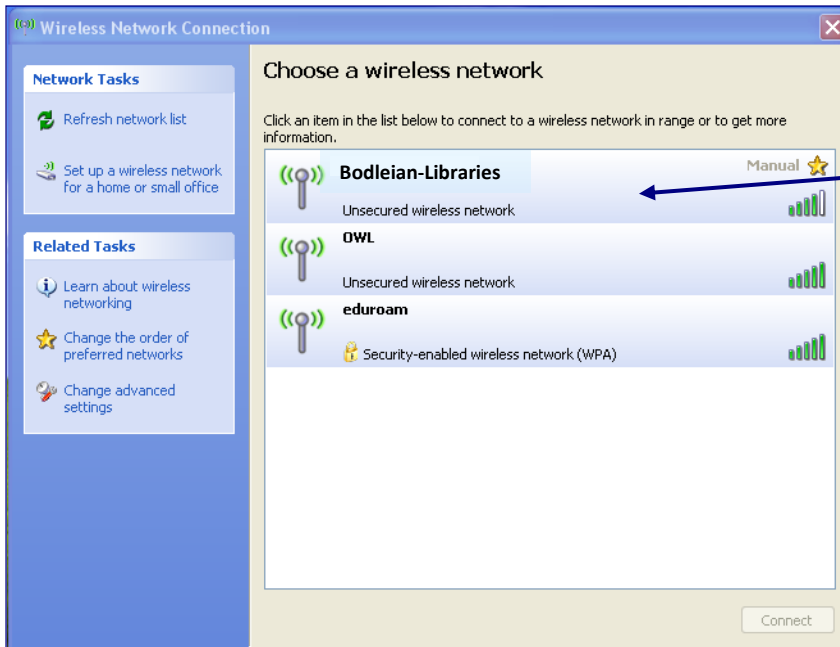


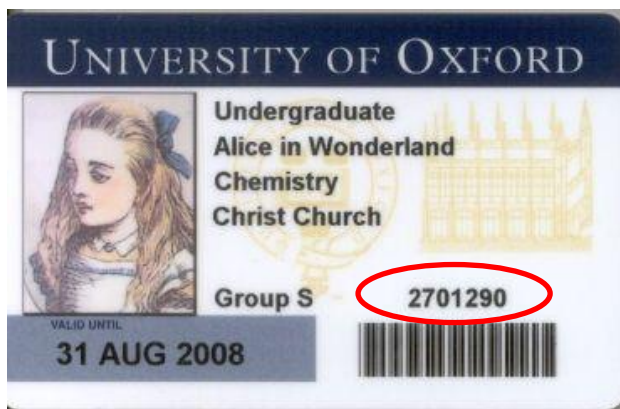
Wireless access at the *efl*

We permit the use of laptops in the library and wireless access is available. The wireless network covers the central seating areas of the library.

However, please note that laptops may only be used at tables on the main floor of the library; this is in response to requests by our readers to maintain a quiet study area in the Gallery.



To use the service please connect to ***Bodleian-Libraries***.



When you open your web browser (e.g. Internet Explorer or Firefox) you will be prompted for your University card barcode number and your password (this is the password you use to log on to the PCs in the library and IT Training Room). If you received your University card during or after September 2011, you will need to set your password before you can use this service.



N.B. If your password is currently the same as your barcode you will need to change it to enable you to access the wireless network.

Please note that if you change your password, your new password will reset within 5 minutes, after which you can login to the wireless network.

If you have forgotten your password please ask a member of staff to reset it. Please note that we can only reset passwords during library opening hours: Mon-Fri 9am-7pm, Sat 10am-1pm (term time) / Mon-Fri 9am-5pm (vacation).

Welcome to the Bodleian Libraries Reading Room Network Service

Please log on using your "patron barcode", that is the number written immediately above the barcode on your Library Card (University Card for University members) and your patron password. This will authorise you to use the network service to access library resources and the wider Internet outside Oxford. The system will remember that your laptop or PDA has been authorised for an hour after you have last been active. After that time, you will have to log on again.

New Library Card holders must set a password before they can use this service. This can be done from a computer with Internet access from the address <http://register.bodleian.ox.ac.uk>. The new password will be emailed to you.

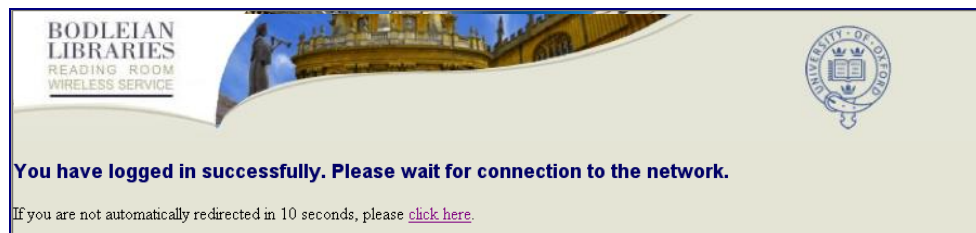
Although library workstations require you to log on using your patron barcode, most reading rooms have terminals called Sun Rays, which do not require logon and can be used for this password reset process. Alternatively, you can ask a member of staff to reset your password for you.

If you are a member of the University, you can also change from the "Bodleian-Libraries" wireless service and use instead "OWL" or "eduroam".

Owners of computers connected to the University network are responsible for the installation and maintenance of up-to-date anti-virus software. Virus-infected computers can be barred from using the University network.

The University has a site licence for the Sophos anti-virus client which is available for MS Windows, Apple Mac OS X and Linux. Members of the University can install the Sophos client on to their own computers for free. Check your version of operating system is supported on the OUCS main AV index page: <http://www.oucs.ox.ac.uk/viruses/> If you have alternative anti-virus software that you are happy with, then it's fine to stay with that as long as it is kept up-to-date.
