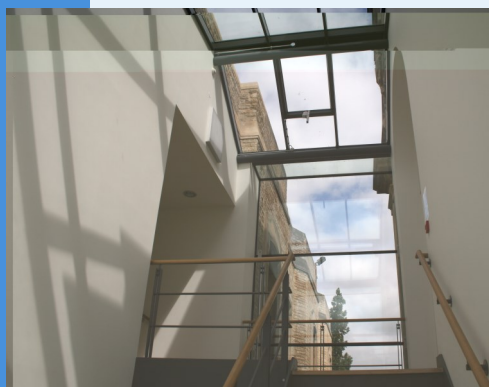

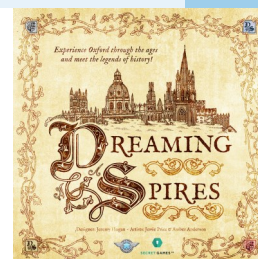

All medical students in England are entitled to an **NHS Athens Account** for the duration of their course. The resources available are those purchased nationally such as the BNF App, but do not include resources acquired for local NHS Trusts. See

All fourth year students should by now have received an email from "Eduserv Athens" advising that an NHS Athens account has been set up. Just click on the link in the email to activate your NHS Athens account and set up a password.
