This paper is an addendum to the *Temporary Science Library Services from the Vere Harmsworth Library* Consultation paper and is aimed at all readers of the Vere Harmsworth Library (VHL) and at the Rothermere American Institute (RAI). It contains VHL and/or History-specific information, and should be read in conjunction, including the RAI's risk assessment and mitigations (Appendix III, *Temporary Science Library Services from the Vere Harmsworth Library*).

The purpose of the consultation is to invite feedback from the academic community on the proposed changes to VHL spaces and collections 2020-21.

This version now includes updates (in yellow highlighting) which document additional details on the latest planning, some in response to feedback received to so far. It also includes additional book move plans following the realisation that in fact 70% of the RSL collections will need to be on the open shelves (as opposed to 60% as originally envisaged).

Summary of key issues:

In the context of the Parks College Project, the plan is for a temporary library provision for Mathematical, Physical and Life Sciences Division (MPLS) and Medical Science Division (MSD) students to be established within the VHL from January 2020 until summer 2021, offering science readers study spaces, group study rooms, open shelf teaching collections, and subject support from dedicated science library staff. This will impact on the VHL, its readers and staff. As the VHL is embedded in the RAI, the project will therefore also impact on its fellows, visitors and staff. Jointly the VHL and RAI are, respectively, the foremost library and institution for supporting the teaching and research activities in American studies this side of the Atlantic. As well as offering an extensive academic knowledge exchange programme and fostering a research community on site, the RAI also actively reaches out to important influencers and donors from across the world. VHL houses the largest US Studies collections in any UK university library and its subject-specialist support is highly praised and valued locally and beyond Oxford. The library also supports the RAI by hosting visits from distinguished VIPs. It is therefore very important to ensure that the temporary science provision in the VHL will not harm any of those endeavours nor the reputation of the RAI and VHL in any way. Having said this, it is also important to be welcoming to the science students and readers who need a temporary library space and service.

A summary of the some key issues are:

- 1. **Seating capacity & increase in reader numbers**: While the VHL is comparatively quiet for most of the year, during Trinity Term reader seating can reach capacity. It is proposed to add 54 additional seats. See details at para 2.3.1, *Temporary Science Library Services from the Vere Harmsworth Library* and A. Spaces (p2).
- 2. VHL collections relegations: The VHL currently has 400 linear metres of empty shelving in the stack and on the open shelves. In order to accommodate 750m of RSL stock, it is proposed to consolidate VHL empty spaces, consolidate VHL oversize collections and relegate selected materials, largely journals, where there is also electronic provision. No monographs would need to be relegated; flagship journal titles would be retained. The open-shelf RSL collection would occupy just under a quarter of the shelving on the second floor and just under half of the VHL closed stack. See details at B Collections (p3).

3. Opening hours: For the duration of the RSL Decant, the VHL would offer longer opening hours to match those of the RSL. It is proposed that RSL library and facilities staff provide additional staffing resources to mitigate against higher use and the need for tighter security in the building.

The consultation process

The consultation consists of the publication of the consultation documents on the VHL website (https://www.bodleian.ox.ac.uk/vhl) on Tuesday 8 October 2019, and meetings with key stakeholders. Feedback can also be given online and anonymously at https://oxford.onlinesurveys.ac.uk/rsl-decant-to-vhl-2020-21-proposal-online-feedback. The deadline for online feedback is Tuesday 22 October, 5pm. The consultation will be publicised via the VHL social media channels from 8 October and emails to history student cohorts, the History Faculty and key RAI contacts.

A. Spaces

The following changes to spaces are proposed in order to accommodate an increase in the number of study desks and group study rooms, to improve security and to improve accessibility.

- 1. Library entrance: work is underway to investigate improving accessibility to the building and the library through various glass doors. Any agreed improvements such as the installation of powered doors will be subject to funding which is outside the scope of the RSL project. Planned modifications are:
 - a. Add Salto access control gates which will be permanently retained and will provide accurate user statistics
 - b. Permanently move book detector gates further into the library space
- 2. Enquiry desk: in order to accommodate a second staffing-point and make the enquiry desk more accessible and welcoming, we aim to alter the enquiry desk, in liaison with the discussions with the RAI. Precise details are not yet available but is likely to involve lowering the height of the desk. Security measures, such as handheld radios with panic buttons, will be put into place to make sure library and RAI staff lone-working in those areas are safe.

- 3. Create an easy-seating area for a New Book & Journal Issue Display for US Studies on the Ground Floor. See Ground Floor plan in Appendix A.
- 4. Add 54 study spaces¹ by adding additional tables on the ground and mezzanine floors and by creating four group study rooms on the far western side of the first and second floors. The latter currently provide easy seating and are very underused. The RAI has indicated interest in taking ownership of those four rooms for offices after the RSL has moved out. The VHL has the option to retaining any additional tables post-RSL move.

 Mitigation:
 - a. Geographers' collections will be in the SSL so we are not expecting them;
 - b. Additional science ebook purchases;
 - c. Longer opening hours;
 - d. Priority seating for core VHL readers details tbc but could include e.g. 2nd floor carrels and other table(s);
 - e. Regular seat counts& notification of seating available in nearby libraries
- 5. Add one additional height-adjustable table from the RSL.
- 6. Keep 2 microfilm readers on the ground floor, but move the 3rd back-up microfilm reader to be stored under the ground floor staircase.
- 7. Remove 2 island cases on the ground floor to free up spaces for an additional table.
- 8. Possibly re-designate the First Floor window study spaces to become the Quiet Study spaces.
- 9. Consider the need and location for additional cycle rack spaces.

The current booking arrangements for RAI DPhils carrels on the 1st floor will remain unchanged as will the current arrangements re the booking and use of the Godfrey Hodgson group study room.

B. Collections

The reduced RSL teaching collection destined to move to the VHL measures 750 linear metres. The total VHL shelf space capacity is 4,883 metres of which 400 metres of shelving space is already vacant, albeit scattered throughout the library. To provide for the remaining 350 metres, in order of priority, and to create 70% of open shelf space for the RSL collection (all lending), it is proposed to:

- 1. Consolidate the vacant space with internal moves. With more efficient shelving, we expect to gain c 94 m.
- 2. Relegate from the VHL stack to Bodleian Acquisitions, Osney Mead, c 1,500 volumes of unprocessed donations for checking and receiving. Many of these are not relevant to the VHL but any titles on US history and deemed important for the VHL will subsequently be repatriated.
- 3. Relegate from the VHL stack to the off-side Book Storage Facility (BSF) for permanent retention:

- a. Duplicate journal issues
- b. Microprint source materials on Italian and British history
- c. Print journals which are available online (see Appendix B for the title list)
- d. New York Times and US Daily oversized volumes.
- 4. Relegate from the open shelves to the BSF for permanent retention:
 - a. Outdated bibliographical publications: Writings on American History (1902-1990 imperfect set), Social Science Abstracts (1929-1932)
 - b. Microforms and CD-ROMs which are available online: Evans' Early American Imprints microcard collection, New York Times and Washington Post.
 - c. Selected reference material: e.g. old edition of the *Dictionary of American Biography, The New Encyclopedia Britannica, AHA Annual Meeting* (historic conference programmes), etc. See Appendix C for the title list.
 - d. Print journals where there is reliable electronic provision from recognised providers. Flagship journals such as *American Historical Review*, *Journal of American History* or *William* and *Mary Quarterly* will not be relegated. The vast major of journals selected are local, regional or state history journals or have been very little used (failed dust test). See Appendix B for the list of titles for relegation.
- 5. Move from the open shelves to the VHL stack:
 - a. The entire Congressional Record (available online) to free up space for the New Book & Journal Issue display, a new temporary reference section and open shelf US Studies printed primary source materials.
 - b. Small selection of source materials which are partly available online and low-use: Bulletin of the American Association of University Professors, National Conference of Social Work, Federal Reserve Bulletin, The Book of the States
- 6. Move from the First Floor to the Ground Floor a core selection of printed primary source materials: Documents on American Foreign Relations, Foreign Relations of the US, USA treaties and other International Acts Series, United States News, Public Papers of the Presidents, Documentary History of First Federal Congress, Documentary History of Ratification of the Constitution, Senate Journal, etc.
- 7. Move from the Second Floor to the Ground Floor: Readers Guide to Periodical Literature and Territorial Papers.

Discussions are ongoing amongst colleagues whether the RSL science collection would be located entirely on the Second Floor (taking up c 30% of the floor space) or split between the Second and First Floor (20% and 11% respectively). Thought has to be given to the sheer scale of internal moves and the disruption thereby caused, as well as the need to reinstate the VHL collections after the RSL collections have moved out.

All other material, comprising monographs, major source collections (FRUS, presidential papers, NAACP, etc.), and print journals without online alternatives will remain on the open shelves. Sufficient growth space for the VHL open shelf collections is included in the calculations.

The science open shelf collections would occupy c 4 of the 19 bays on the Second Floor. The science closed stack collections would occupy c 7 bays of 15 in the basement stack. C 15m will need to be created on the far western side of the Second Floor (opposite the Science Common Room) for a Science New Book Display.

C. Services

To accommodate the expected increase on Library PCs, PCAS machines, book stack requests, the following are proposed:

- 1. Add 2 additional PCs from the RSL; investigate feasibility of adding at least 1 stand-up Quick Look-Up terminal by the self-collect shelving.
- 2. Add 1 additional PCAS machine from the RSL
- 3. Provide Self-Collect point for stack requests on the remaining 3 island cases on the ground floor. This means that readers who order material from the Closed Stack to be delivered to the VHL Self-Collect point will be able to collect these items directly from the shelves without having to wait for a member of staff to hand them on². There will be some material which, for security reasons, can only be requested to the library staff desk.
- 4. Opening hours: See para 2.3.3, Temporary Science Library Services from the Vere Harmsworth Library
- 5. The impact on wifi will need to be assessed and additional wifi points may need to be installed.

The current arrangement regarding reserving open shelf materials overnight at the enquiry desk will remain but is likely to be re-provided elsewhere on the Ground Floor.

D. Library staff, subject-specialist support and customer service

Library staff have been included in the planning and are also invited to more formally respond to the consultation. Terms and conditions for library staff are not expected to change though a review of opening hours across Bodleian Libraries is currently underway which may or may not lead to changes.

While many processes are the same across Bodleian Libraries already, VHL and RSL library staff are working together to make sure that training, staff manuals and operations are as efficient and effective as possible. Staff will also need to be trained in some RAI matters. We are keen to ensure that the high-quality customer service our readers are accustomed to will continue. Subject-specialist support offered by the Vere Harmsworth Librarian will continue to be offered. Discussions regarding senior staff cover during opening hours will take place in order to ensure the Vere Harmsworth Librarian's workload is not excessively impacted on.

Library staff will also continue to liaise closely with RAI colleagues. Particularly in the early weeks, it will be important for monitor the use of the library and building carefully and to listen to feedback from students, researchers and the RAI in order to identify potentially issues as early as possible and address them.

E. Building work and disruption

At the point of writing, details of when significant and disruptive building work in the library would take place are not available. We will minimise noise and disruption as much as possible by scheduling work during Christmas vacation, esp. close to the Christmas³ and/or very early January, or before library opening times. Much is dependent on contractor availability.

The lack of a reliable lift, needed in particular for collection moves but also for accessibility, is currently of concern. The RAI Administrator and Bodleian Libraries colleagues are working in liaison with OU Estates Services to ensure that repairs and any ongoing maintenance requirements are treated with higher priority.

Beyond building works, there will be internal book moves and moves of books out of and into the building. Any book moves not affecting public spaces can be scheduled during term-time. All others will be done, as much as possible, during vacation time. The VHL will draw on the support of the highly experienced and efficient Bodleian Libraries book moving team. The RAI's staff entrance will probably be the best and least disruptive route in and out of the building but precise details and risk assessments still need to be drawn up.

The VHL beyond summer 2021

While the temporary decant of the RSL services and collections to the VHL presents us with some relatively short-time pain as well as some long-term gains, there is now a need to review, in a way yet to be determined, the long-term vision of the VHL collections and services beyond the return of science collections to Parks College in summer 2021. The next 18 months present an opportunity to discuss with the American Studies community in Oxford what this vision should be. Thought should be given to providing a broader and more rounded American Studies collection and potentially covering areas of interest in line with new upcoming trends in the discipline.






Ground Floor




First floor & Mezzanine

Appendix C. A list of reference titles to be considered for relegation

In line with the RSL Decant Project 2020-2021 proposed book moves, the Vere Harmsworth Library will be required to relocate a significant number of our Reference titles. This document lists the proposed reference titles to be relegated, alongside their justification and proposed new location. This has been provided so that our Readers and RAI Fellows are able to consult the relegation list, and raise any concerns or suggestions related to the proposed titles. The Vere Harmsworth Library, alongside the Bodleian Libraries will take these responses into consideration when composing the final relegation list.

Methodology

In order to begin the relegation task, the Vere Harmsworth Librarian created a list of all Reference titles. From this she identified possible candidates for relegation based on bibliographic information, subject and number of volumes/issues. Once this was completed, she then checked holdings for the reference titles in other Bodleian Libraries and online accessibility. Measurements of shelf length (in millimetres) and the number of shelves taken up by titles were also recorded.

Titles were first assessed for relegation based on their relevance to current American Studies in History and Politics, specifically wanting to keep titles which are most useful to our current Readers, and/or only available within the Vere Harmsworth. Secondly, titles were assessed on their easy availability to Vere Harmsworth Readers, either through the Bodleian Libraries or online open access. Duplicates which the Vere Harmsworth already held on the open shelves or Stack were also candidates for relegation. Finally, the shelf length and volume numbers were considered, to create the maximum amount of space available, whilst not significantly affecting the reference works available to our Readers.

When possible, relegation decisions have been made which allow for the future return of Reference works back to the Vere Harmsworth after the RSL Decant Project. However, the Reference Collection is old and rarely used. This project provide the Vere Harmsworth the opportunity to consider the purpose of the Reference Collection, and how to make it an effective and relevant part of our Collections.

Understanding the relegation list

The below list is ordered by the relegation decision made by the Vere Harmsworth Librarian. Titles are listed alongside some bibliographic details, measurements and justification for the relegation decisions.

There are four possible decisions listed:

• Move to Open Shelves

- Relegate to Stack
- Relegate to BSF
- Remove from the Library

Of the four decisions listed, only Removal from the VHL Library would mean a title would be permanently removed from the Vere Harmsworth. Items relegated to the Stack and BSF would still be available for Readers to consult by placing a Hold Request. Titles which we notice have a large number of requests could be moved back to the Vere Harmsworth to relieve demand, at the discretion of the Vere Harmsworth Librarian.

Move to Open Shelves

In the context of this list, Open Shelves refer to the shelves located on the First and Second Floors of the Library, which can be accessed and browsed by Readers. Titles can be located on Solo.

There are several reasons for suggesting moving titles onto the Open Shelves. Firstly, when previous, current or future editions are already shelved on the Open Shelves of the Vere Harmsworth. For research and consistency, it would make sense to shelve titles together as much as possible. Secondly, titles which the Librarian considers as historical

Temporary Science Library Services from the Vere Harmsworth Library - History addendum — updated 22 Oct 2019 Relegate to the VHL Closed Stack

The Vere Harmsworth Library has a small basement Stack with limited space for books and other library material. Items can be requested by Readers through SOLO, and can be fetched by Librarians for Readers to use in the Library. Relegation to Stack has the added benefit of being easily reachable by Librarians if titles have a sudden surge in usage or interest.

A key factor in sending items into the Stack includes titles which the librarian considers relevant and useful to Readers of the Library, but may be considered dated, or to have very little usage. This includes several atlases, which although useful visual material, often have low usage, and can be difficult to handle for Readers and Library staff.

It also includes now dated reference material, but are of historical value and interest to researchers. The Vere Harmsworth Librarian believes that such material should be persevered in the best way possible, whilst also remaining within the Vere Harmsworth Library building as much as possible. Therefore, moving such items to the Stack would best suite these items.

Relegate to the BSF

The Bodleian Library is able to send some of its low use titles to the Bodleian Swindon Facility (BSF). Items can be stored safely, either on a permanent basis, or temporarily for short term projects. It would therefore make sense to make use of the BSF in storing some of our items at the BSF during the Project. Titles can be recalled from the BSF by Readers to other Bodleian Libraries, although this will take a longer period of time then titles relegated to the Stack. Titles can also be recalled to the Vere Harmsworth Library and returned to the Open Shelves or the Stack if necessary.

Items which the Library is hoping to send to the BSF are mainly focused on titles which only have some or minimal relevance to our Readers, are particularly bulky or large, and are easily accessible to our Readers through online access or items that have multiple copies. Notably several of the titles in this list include some dictionaries. The Reference Collection includes a number of dictionaries and thesauruses, many of which are dated, or overlap. It would therefore be of use to the Librarian to know how regularly these kind of reference materials are being used, and which titles can be relegated to the BSF.

Whilst the Vere Harmsworth Library holds some foreign language titles within the Collection, they are not regularly consulted. The dictionaries listed here are dated. If dictionaries in foreign languages would be useful for the Reference Collection in the long term, it would be useful to consider titles which are more specific to historical and current American experience, rather than general language dictionaries.
