New university OA policy

The University has a new Open Access policy, approved on 1st March 2018 by the Research & Innovation Committee and the Open Access Project Group. The new policy replaces the 2013 Statement on Open Access.

The 15,000th deposit for Act on Acceptance at Oxford was a journal article co-authored by Richard Stevens, Julie Evans and Jason Oke and colleagues from the Nuffield Department of Primary Care Health Sciences in CMAJ: Canadian Medical Association Journal, entitled "Kidney age, not kidney disease".

The new design is a major step in the ongoing improvement of ORA: work continues to improve the underlying technologies and data.




Green Impact news

The RSL Green Impact team has been busy. We have recycled 9.5 kilos of used batteries, 8 kilos of used writing instruments, and 5-6 kilos per week of food waste from the staff common room. Also, regular recycling of paper, cardboard and plastic bottles amounted to 30% of all waste July to September 2017 and 41% October to December 2017. This reflects a similar level of recycling over the same period in 2016-17, following a 10% increase over the same period in 2015-16.

- Turning off the lights
- Printing in black and white and double-sided

Our energy audits will be fed into discussions on how the Radcliffe Science Library can be made more environmentally sustainable as it undergoes a major renovation in the next few years.
