

NIHR implements “Gold” approach to Open Access

Any peer-reviewed research articles supported in whole or in part by [NIHR](http://www.nihr.ac.uk)

funding, that are submitted for publication and published from 1st April 2014 should be made available under the “Gold” approach to Open Access - which means the report is free at the time of publication. This includes review articles not commissioned by publishers, final reports or executive summaries. The NIHR recognises that there will be progressive implementation, but expects full compliance in four years. NIHR Programmes will monitor compliance with this policy and will be providing further guidance on how to comply with the policy over the summer. Full details on the revised policy will be made available shortly.

Sir William Osler and the Bodleian

Sir William Osler, physician and bibliophile (1849-1919), was one of the most respected doctors in the world in the early 20th century. As Regius Professor of Medicine at Oxford 1905-1919 he took a keen interest in the work and collections of the Bodleian Library. On display at this exhibition will be a selection of books and manuscripts illustrating Osler's close relationship with the Bodleian as Curator, adviser, friend and benefactor.
