Transfer of History of STM collections from RSL to central Bodleian

The RSL's open-shelf collections for history of science, medicine and technology are to move to the Upper Reading Room, Bodleian Library, in the coming weeks and starting 18 June at the earliest. This affects books and periodicals from the old 'Hist.' sections. Lending copies from the former Hooke, Geography, Experimental Psychology, Plant Sciences and Zoology libraries will remain at RSL. The aim is to unite the dispersed history of science collections into one central location, which complements well the existing sections on intellectual and religious history. It is hoped that key European publications and sources will be added from the Book Storage Facility, Swindon, to form a comprehensive section of source materials and key critical literature. The History Faculty's History of Science, Technology and Medicine Committee "strongly endorsed the move, and welcomed the constitution of a reference section in the history of science and allied fields as adding this dimension to historical and literary studies." It is hoped to complete this move with minimal disruption to RSL readers and that books will be unavailable for one day at the most.

The Cochrane Library provides access to full text *Cochrane Systematic Reviews*, and structured abstracts of other systematic reviews published in medical and health journals. It includes a register of controlled clinical trials and is updated every three months.

Liz Callow - Outreach Librarian for Paediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynaecology

Liz Callow is our Outreach Librarian covering the **Nuffield Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology** and the **University Department of Paediatrics**, as well as Paediatrics, Pharmacy, Women's Services and Allied Health Therapies across the **OUP Trust**. Examples from Liz of her support for patient care and research include:

“A doctor working on the Neonatal Unit contacted me in May 2011 for help with literature and links to international guidelines on chicken pox in neonates. This was required for a new OUP Trust guideline in the Neonatal Unit, and the guideline was finished and implemented in November 2011.”

“Evidence based nutritional plans have been developed for particular patient groups (those having total pancreatectomy, patients having total or extended gastrectomy, patients with chyle leaks, bariatric surgery patients having gastric by-pass) on the basis of my literature searching support during the year.”

As part of her general support to researchers, Liz has familiarized herself with **Symplectic**, the system used to collect papers for the REF and has helped find articles that had eluded the automatic searching systems.

Liz is also co-author on a recently published Cochrane Systematic Review **[Home uterine monitoring for detecting preterm labour](#)**

Student Barometer Survey Results

The University has announced the results of its 2011 **International Student Barometer** survey, which contains three library-oriented questions inviting expressions of satisfaction with:

- University's online library facilities (such as e-journals)
- University's physical library facilities
- Colleges' physical library facilities

Undergraduate members of the Medical

Sciences Division have expressed high levels of satisfaction with both physical and online library facilities. 98.9% of students were 'Satisfied' or 'Very Satisfied' with their physical library facilities. 96.7% of students were 'Satisfied' or 'Very Satisfied' with online library facilities.
