Mental Health, Social Media and the Internet: Bodleian-led Web Archive Collection

As one of the six Legal Deposit Libraries in the UK, the Bodleian is actively involved in the [Legal Deposit UK Web Archive](#), a project that aims to preserve UK websites for future research. As well as the "general collection" of the UK web, the Legal Deposit Libraries curate themed special collections. Recent collections have included the 2015 General Election, the First World War centenary and the UK response to the Ebola crisis.

The Bodleian Libraries is currently curating a collection on "Mental Health, Social Media and the Internet" looking at the following themes: Addiction, Body Image, Inclusivity vs. Cyberbullying, Social Media Usage Impact on Mental Health, and material relevant to mental health, social media and the internet more generally.

The web sources we will be considering are academic research, online news pieces, social media initiatives/ organisations/charities, blogs, forums and social media accounts. Only UK based websites can be included.

We are looking for suggestions of websites for potential inclusion in the collection. Please send suggestions to Iram Safdar (iram.safdar@bodleian.ox.ac.uk) or Carl Cooper (carl.cooper@bodleian.ox.ac.uk). We will be working on the collection until May 2018.

New Oxford policy for RCUK Open Access block grant

Research Committee has approved a revised policy for allocating funds from Oxford's RCUK Open Access block grant, in order to best manage the limited funds remaining in our 2017/18 RCUK block grant. The new policy took effect on Monday 21st August 2017 and prioritises Article Processing Charges (APCs) for fully open access journals. 
COAF Block Grant update
