### Where's That Book?

Returning readers will notice some books have new home. The project to have one classification scheme in the library has been progressing over the summer and locations have moved as a result

The LCC sequence is now split across both floors. Shelfmarks up to PR6999 can be found downstairs. LCC shelfmarks beginning PR8000 (Scottish Literature), PR9000 (Postcolonial/Other Literatures in English), PS (American Literature), PT (Germanic + Scandinavian Literature) and Z (Bibliography) can now be found upstairs.
