Parliamentary Bills

An Act to Repeal a Clause in an Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty (for Amending and Repairing the Highways) which Enjoyns Waggoners and others to Draw with a Pole between the Wheel-Horses, or with Double Shafts, and to Oblige them to Draw only with Six Horses or other Beasts, except up Hills. 1708.

An Act to render more Effectual an Act made in the Sixth Year of Her present Majesty, Intituled, An Act to Repeal a Clause in an Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, for Amending the Highways, which enjoyns Waggoners and others to Draw with a Pole between the Wheel-horses, or with Double Shafts, and to oblige them to Draw only with Six Horses, or other Beasts, except up Hills

An Act for Explaining the Acts for Licensing Hackney-Chairs, 1713. 2 copies.

An Act for Better Regulating Hackney-Coaches, Carts, Drays, Carrs, and Waggons, within the Cities of London and Westminster, and the weekly Bills of Mortality; and for Preventing Mischiefs occasioned by the Drivers riding upon such Carts, Drays, Carrs, and Waggons. 1716. 2 copies

An Act to Repeal so much of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for the Preservation of the Publick Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England, as obliges Persons not travelling for Hire to make use of Waggons with Wheels bound with Streaks or Tyre of a certain Breadth, or the said Streaks to be fastened with Nails of a certain Size. 1741

An Act for continuing certain Laws relating to the additional Number of One hundred Hackney Chairs, and to the Powers given for regulating Hackney Coaches and Chairs. 1760.

An Act for licensing an additional Number of Hackney Coaches, and applying the Monies arising thereby. 1771

An Act for punishing Offences committed by Hackney Coachmen and Chairmen, within certain Districts and Places therein mentioned; and for renewing the Registry of Carts and Carriages. 1771

An Act for repealing an Act, made in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Duties on Licences to be taken out by all Persons letting Horses to Hire, for travelling in the Manner therein mentioned; and certain Duties on all Horses let to Hire for the Purposes of travelling Post, and by Time and upon certain Carriages therein mentioned; and for granting other Duties in lieu thereof. 1780

An Act for granting to His Majesty certain additional Duties on Horses in Great Britain; and for exempting from Duty, Horses kept for the Purpose of Husbandry, by Persons holding Farms under a certain Value. 1801

An Act to authorize the licensing an additional Number of Hackney Coaches. 1802

An Act for granting to His Majesty additional Duties in Great Britain on Horses used in riding, or for drawing certain Carriages; and for consolidating the said additional Duties with the present Duties thereon. 1805

An Act for further continuing, until the First Day of February One Thousand eight hundred and nine, an Act, made in the Twenty-seventh Year of His present Majesty for enabling the Commissioners of the Treasury to let to Farm the Duties on Horses let to Hire for travelling Post, and by Time. 1805.

An Act for repealing the Rates and Taxes taken by licensed Hackney Coachmen, and for establishing others in lieu thereof; and for amending several Laws relating to Hackney Coaches. 1808

An Act for letting to Farm the Duties on Horses hired by the Mile or Stage, to be used in travelling, and on Horses hired for a less Period of Time than Twenty-eight Days, for drawing Carriages used in travelling Post, or otherwise, in Great Britain, and for better securing the said Duties. 1808

An Act for placing the Duties of Hawkers and Pedlars under the Management of the Commissioners of Hackney Coaches. 1810

An Act to explain the Exemption from Toll in several Acts of Parliament, for Carriages employed in Husbandry; and for regulating the Tolls to be paid on other Carriages, and on Horses, in certain other Cases, therein specified. 1812

An Act for letting to Farm the Post Horses Duties and for better securing and facilitating

the Recovery of said Duties. 1817

An Act for granting to His Majesty several Rates and Duties upon Waggons, Wains, Carts, and other such Carriages, not charged with any Duty under the Management of the Commissioners of Excise. (Undated)
