Loose photographs comprising three week trip to Sian (Xian) Yenan Taiyuan in 1965 (22 photos); Old Summer Palace (2 photos); students from the school/college where Elsie taught (3 photos); 2nd National Games closing ceremony, Sep 1965 (9 photos); Ming Tombs (4 photos); the Great Wall of China (16 photos); various locations including some of Elsie with colleagues from the Foreign Languages Press (57 photos) and unidentified locations (10 photos).
- 4. Margaret Clark's account of her mother's time in China, 1964-1966, with THE MARRIAGE LAW OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA (Foreign Languages Press, Peking, 1977) and THE CONSTITUTION OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA (Foreign Languages Press, Peking, 1978) acquired by Margaret Clark on a tour of China in 1978.
- 5. Book created in 2021 by Margaret Clark (Elsie's daughter), Jim Clark (Elsie's grandson) and Matthew Edge (Elsie's great-grandson) containing photographs of Elsie's time in China, of Margaret's study tour of China organised by the British Association of Social Workers in 1978 and selected photographs of Elsie from childhood to old age.

Biographical / Historical

The British and Foreign Anti-Slavery and Aborigines' Protection Society was formed in 1909 through the amalgamation of the two bodies that form its name.

The roots of the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society go back to the 18th century, and the beginnings of a largely Quaker-inspired movement to abolish the slave trade. However, even after the abolition of the trade in Britain in 1807, and the emancipation of slaves in the colonies in 1834, an alternative form of slavery, the 'apprenticeship system' continued until 1838 in the West Indies. Against this background, in 1823, a number of men led by William Wilberforce and Sir Thomas Fowell Buxton began to meet regularly in London to discuss the slave trade and slavery in British possessions. The resulting organisation, the Committee on Slavery, later changed its name to The Society for the Amelioration and Gradual Abolition of Slavery, and in 1835 to the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society, committed to ending slavery worldwide. During the 19th century, the Society campaigned on a number of related issues, including the trade in slave-cultivated sugar from Brazil and Cuba, and the East African slave trade (resulting from its close contacts with Dr. Livingstone). In the 1890s its mandate began to include the ill treatment of indigenous peoples, leading to its eventual merger with the Aborigines' Protection Society.

The Aborigines' Protection Society was founded in 1837 by Dr. Thomas Hodgkin and others through a Parliamentary Select Committee set up in 1835 to investigate means of ensuring justice, 'spreading civilization', etc. among the indigenous peoples of the Empire. Its first president was Sir Thomas Fowell Buxton, and its early work included the establishment of correspondence with "intelligent and benevolent individuals abroad", the publication of several reports, including on the natives of Australia, Upper Canada and South Africa, and the general arousal of public opinion. For most of the 19th century it continued to lobby in the same geographical areas, as well as against encroachments on Native American territory, the traffic in labourers from Asia and Polynesia, and the sale of liquor to indigenous peoples.

After World War One the newly amalgamated British and Foreign Anti-Slavery and Aborigines' Protection Society attempted to work with the League of Nations to make the respect of human rights part of international law. This work culminated in 1956 with the Supplementary Convention on the Abolition of Slavery, the Slave Trade and Institutions and Practices Similar to Slavery, which listed and defined all slave-related practices. In 1975 it campaigned for the setting up of a panel of experts in the United Nations, later known as the Working Group on Contemporary Forms of Slavery. In 1990 the Society changed its name to Anti-Slavery International. Its main current areas of interest include debt bondage, the trafficking of human beings and the worst forms of child labour.

In terms of related organisations relevant to this collection, the Mico Charity administered funds for the education of former slaves (though the legacy was not used for this purpose until after the establishment of the apprenticeship system in the West Indies and the subsequent setting up of schools for apprentices and their children); the National Freedmen's Aid Society was in close communication with an American society of the same name established after the Civil War; and the Committee for the Welfare of Africans in Europe was formed during World War One to protect the welfare of native labour contingents in France and to care for native fighting forces.

Anti-Slavery International was formed in 1839 as the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society. Over the years the organisation's name has changed several times:

- 1. 1839-1909: The British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society
- 2. 1909-1947: The Anti-Slavery Society and Aborigines Protection Society
- 3. 1947-1956: The Anti-Slavery Society
- 4. 1956-1990: The Anti-Slavery Society for the Protection of Human Rights
- 5. 1990-1995: Anti-Slavery International for the Protection of Human Rights
- 6. 1995-present: Anti-Slavery International

Immediate Source of Acquisition

The papers of the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society and Aborigines Protection Society up to 1941 were purchased from the Society for the Bodleian Library by the Rhodes Trustees in 1951. It was agreed that the Library would have the right to acquire, at ten year intervals, the Society's papers of the previous decade. When the 1941-1951 accession was due to arrive a second payment was made to the Society to ensure that all of its papers to the end of the twentieth century would come to the Library.

With the Accessions 1941-1951 came the papers of Kathleen, Lady Simon, DBE, the wife of Sir John Simon, PCSI, GCVO. These papers had been deposited after her death on 27th March 1955 by her son, B.O'D. Manning, with the Anti-Slavery Society. When the Society's 1941-1951 papers were acquired by the Library Mr. Manning gave his mother's papers as an addition.

Related Materials

The Anti-Slavery Society Pictorial Collection is also held by the Bodleian Library. This comprises lantern slides and glass negatives mainly relating to Africa and dating from the late 19th and early 20th centuries.



What is Discovery?



Hill, Sir Stephen John (1809–1891), colonial governor, born on 10 June 1809, was the son of Major William Hill and his wife, Sarah. He entered the army in 1823, became lieutenant in 1825, and was promoted captain in 1842. On 30 November 1829 he married Sarah Ann, the daughter of William Vesey Munnings, chief justice of the Bahamas. In 1849 he commanded an expedition which proceeded 80 miles up the River Gambia. On 6 May he stormed and destroyed the fortified town of Bambacoo, and on the following day attacked and partially destroyed the fortified town of Keenung; he also fought a successful action on the plains of Quenella. He commanded a detachment of the 2nd and 3rd West India regiments in a successful attack by the British and French naval and land forces under Commodore Fanshawe on the pirates of the island of Basis, on the Jeba River, west Africa. For this service he received the thanks of the lords of the Admiralty and the brevet rank of major.

Conversation with M. Cambon: African frontiers

Foreign Office, February 15, 1899.

Sir,

To-day M. Cambon renewed the question of the line to be drawn in Africa between the territories under Anglo-Egyptian and under French control. He said that, accepting the definitive objection of Her Majesty's Government to any arrangement which would admit French sovereignty or the French flag into the basin of the Nile, M. Delcassé did not persist in the views which the Ambassador, on his behalf, had expressed on Wednesday last. He was willing to adopt the proposal which should take the line from the frontier of the Congo State northward, along the water-parting between the waters of the Ubanghi and the Nile. When it reached Darfur the line would be so drawn as to leave Darfur upon the Anglo-Egyptian side. But he begged me to furnish him with a tracing of the frontier which, in our conception, separated Darfur from Wadai. Going further north, the line would, as had been previously arranged, go to the north-east foot of the Tibestu Mountains. M. Delcassé, however, was of opinion that the best mode of recording the Agreement between the two Powers was to make the present Arrangement a Supplement or Annex to the Convention which was agreed upon in June 1898 in respect to the countries bordering on the Niger and Lake Chad, and which was now awaiting ratification at the hands of the French Chamber. If this view were accepted, words would be added to the Article dealing with Lake Chad in the Convention to which he referred, which would place on record the delimitation which he had just indicated to me. At the same time, all the commercial questions connected with this delimitation might be satisfactorily settled by extending to the territories which it affected the stipulations contained in the IXth Article of the Niger Convention in regard to the commercial privileges conferred reciprocally upon British subjects and French citizens.

I replied that the suggestion, on the whole, seemed to me judicious, and likely to give satisfaction to both Powers, but that before I could give a definitive assent he must allow me some time to take the opinion of persons acquainted with the locality.





THE REVOLUTION IN CHINA.


1. When the Hukuang Railway Loan Agreement, which was signed on the 20th May, 1911, was being negotiated, the Chinese Government decided, with a view to disarm provincial opposition to its terms, that branch lines would continue to be constructed by provincial companies, but that all trunk or main lines would become the property of the State, and an Imperial edict to this effect was issued on the 9th May and promulgated throughout the provinces concerned. This decision of the Imperial Government caused great dissatisfaction in the provinces of Hupei, Hunan, and Kwangtung, and in Szechuan it led to violent opposition, resulting in armed rebellion and bloodshed. This rebellion was the precursor of, if it did not actually hasten the signal for, the general revolution, of which there had been sporadic mutterings earlier in the year, especially at Cauton, where unsuccessful attempts were made on the lives of the Viceroy and admiral, and two Manchu Tartar-Generals were assassinated—one having been shot dead in the streets, while the other, his successor, was killed by a bomb when in the act of landing to take up his post-and the all out simultaneous outbreak at a later date in many of the provinces shows the revolution to have been of very careful and widespread organisation. This rising in Szechuan, fomented by a party calling itself the Railway Conservation League, spread rapidly through the province, and many cities in the neighbourhood of the provincial capital fell into rebel hands; but Chengtu itself, although for a long time besieged by armed mobs, continued to hold out.


