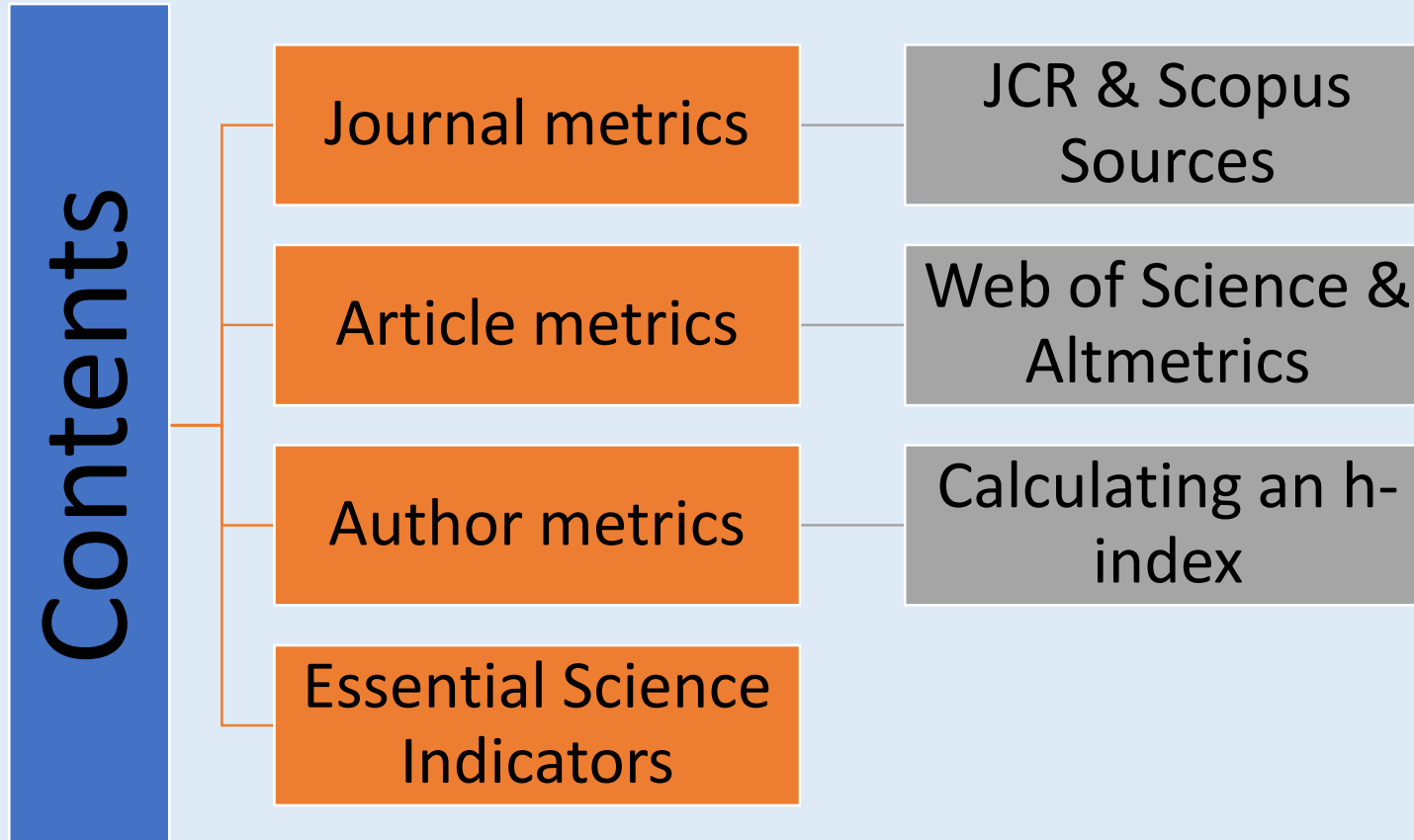

Calculating an H-index

- Considers –
 - Number of papers produced
 - Number of citations received
 - E.g. an h-index of 5 means I have produced at least 5 papers that have been cited at least 5 times each

Papers	Citations
1	43
2	31
3	17
4	11
5	7
6	4
7	3
8	1
9	0

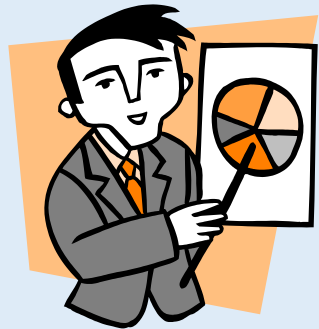
