

John Johnson Collection: Johnson Adds Pateman Collection (Protest Ephemera)

Index revised June 2024

Trevor Pateman has given two collections of protest ephemera to the John Johnson Collection, the first in the 1970s and the second in 2012. They now form a continuous sequence (Pateman 1 – 13 and Pateman 14 – 21).

Extent: 21 boxes

Conspectus to the first Pateman collection

The shelfmarking of the first Pateman collection is confusing. In 1979 each item was indexed and assigned a box and item-level shelfmark within ‘bundles’ which corresponded to the different subjects represented in the collection. These numbers were written on the documents, where they remain. 3.5.2, for example, represents the former box 3, bundle 5, item 2, i.e. Students for a Labour Victory [1970], as in the index below.

Subsequently the Pateman collection was given Johnson book shelfmarks Johnson c.172 – c.179 and Johnson b.64 and transferred to the stack. The old box, bundle and item numbers remained.

The collection has now been re-boxed for conservation reasons and the boxes have been transferred back to the John Johnson Collection of Printed Ephemera (as one of the Johnson Adds collections).

The new shelfmarks (Pateman 1 onwards) do not correspond to the former boxing, hence the need for this conspectus.

Part of the reason for transferring the collection to Johnson Books was the inclusion of individual entries by title for some of the rarer periodicals. These remain on SOLO, and the shelfmarks have been amended to reflect the new boxing. The old stack shelfmarks (which should no longer be used) can be found by searching the copy-specific notes in Advanced Search.

It is suggested that readers use the new box numbers as the primary reference, with the option to include in brackets the item-level number if desired, e.g. Pateman 4 (formerly 3.5.1).
