The Library is required to comply with the Re-use of Public Sector Information Regulations 2015. This regulates how information it holds or creates is made available for re-use.

Statement of Public Task

This statement sets out the functions carried out by the Bodleian Libraries that are within the Libraries' public task under the Re-use of Public Sector Information Regulations 2005.

The Bodleian Libraries advances learning, research and innovation from the heart of the University of Oxford through curating, collecting and unlocking the world's information.

Under the Legal Deposit Libraries Act 2003, Copyright and Related Rights Act 2000 (Ireland) and the Legal Deposit Libraries (Non-Print Works) Regulations 2013, the Bodleian Library acts as a deposit library entitled to claim printed and electronic works published in the United Kingdom.

This statement of public task is reviewed in tandem with the review of the Bodleian Libraries strategic plan and is due to be considered again in 2022.

In an effort to make portions of our collections open to a wide variety of users from around the world for learning, teaching and research, the Bodleian Libraries have been digitizing library content for nearly twenty years. The result is over one million freely available digital objects.

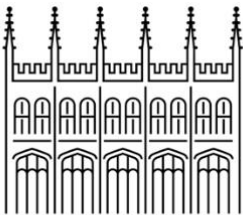
